Since I was first elected, I have served the central, Edmonton, and North East regions of the province, attending and contributing to hundreds of chapter, Local, and Area Council elections and events. It is an honour and a privilege to serve, and help our members make progressive improvements in their workplaces and hence in their personal lives!

Along with my COPA committee, I brought the leaders of the Provincial opposition parties to the 2014 convention to debate the issues important to our members. We piloted a get out the vote campaign, which helped 4 AUPE members become MLA's, including COPA's own Heather Sweet.

The biggest COPA event of this past 2-year term was, in cooperation with AUPE's education department, the planning, scheduling and implementation of a conference on political action entitled People Powered Politics. 190 of our members attended. The objective was to become more politically confident and active. About a dozen MLA's and Ministers attended a social we had whom our members held accountable on important issues.

As Board member of the Public Service Pension Plan we kept the promise of delivering more pension education (last year's convention). We had education sessions in many of our offices – both PSPP and LAPP – and are currently finalizing a plan with APS to deliver more education throughout Alberta at our regional offices.

The work I am most proud of was supporting our 35 brothers and sisters locked out of Points West Living Cold Lake for 6 months! I spent many cold mornings with these brave brothers and sisters greeting scabs with enthusiasm, with the end result that a CA was signed and new labour legislation was created to bring about a better workplace.

Should I be re-elected, I will keep doing these things, but most of all I want to spend more time at the work sites and with Local Bargaining committees getting to know our grassroots members better!

If we want a robust and engaged membership we need to allow union members to become involved in the decision-making process.

Trade unionists and trade unions continue to face many challenges in the 21st Century; declining membership and continued negative propaganda coming from the "right." AUPE must continue it's lead role in Alberta; unionizing workers, educating the general public about the work we do, and forming alliances with other unions and progressive organizations in Alberta and throughout Canada.

In conclusion, I will base all my decisions on the trade union principles and ethics of democracy, humanism and collective responsibility.
